Impact of Sports Premium 2022-2023

As a result of PE spending in 2021-2022:

Items highlighted in green show sustainability.

- The school still has its PE Gold Mark. This means at All Saints', we are continuing to provide many opportunities for children to develop in Sport and Physical Education.
- 2240 hours of after school sports classes were made available to children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 covering hockey, athletics, multi-sports, cheerleading, archery, gymnastics, tag rugby, fencing, cricket, speed stacks, football and dance.
- Staff lead netball, cheerleading, football, tag rugby and cricket coaching which was made available to KS2 children to ready them for competitions during the year.
- Increased participation in active activities during lunch times and play times using the new football posts, new netball posts and playground equipment. This means the posts and equipment will be used for many years to come.
- Participation in competitions has not been hampered by COVID-19 restrictions this
 year and 448 children represented the school in 21 competitions and team events.
 Year on Year, the skills in these pupils who compete improve and develop over the
 years, creating sustainability in enthusiasm and participation.
- Playmaker training sessions were made available to the current Year 5 children as part of their PE lessons. They learned how to play playground games, and then to teach and lead playground games. This term, they have each used these skills to teach games to the younger children in KS1. This creates sustainability for years to come as these children sometimes become Sports Leaders at their senior schools, in part because of their leadership encounters with the Playmakers.
- Provision of expert sport teaching has been good with outstanding elements. Our sports coaches have been helping support teachers in developing hockey, golf and tag rugby skills. This has been hugely successful as the children love it, the teachers also gain confidence and new ways to teach. It is a terrific way to upskill the teachers and a great use of the PE budget as their experience will help them next academic year to teach the sport independently.
- We have no more room left for PE equipment! Our cupboards are bursting with wonderful equipment for both the top and bottom playgrounds, the teachers' PE outdoor store shed and the hall cupboard too. This will help PE continue to be a big part of the school. Pupils use the equipment daily and have been encouraged to take ownership and help tidy the equipment away after each session. This will help look after the equipment for the future.
- Top up swimming has been paid for from the PE budget. This helps our pupils to gain confidence in the water and gives them more time to get to the gold safety award.

Many of our children enter year 4 as non swimmers (usually over 60%) and some have never been in a swimming pool before. For them to get to such a high standard by the end of Primary school is a big ask. This helps to ensure all our children are confident in the water which will help them in their lives, and hopefully promote a love of the water for the future.

• We have used some of the money from the PE budget this year to encourage Physical development of pupils with SEND, with the purchase of a disco light box for dancing inside, soft play equipment for our special needs room and some fine motor skills activities to help with dexterity and fine finger movement. We feel this will benefit those children who use the Rainbow room to use their bodies in a variety of ways and to develop both fine and gross motor skills for the future.

Plans for use of PE Sports Premium in the year 2023-2024

- *Funding for extra swimming for the pupils entering Year 6 in September 2023.
- *Add some wall games for pupils (eyespy, cricket stumps, active boards, as well as noughts and crosses so less active children will be encouraged to stand rather than sit.
- *Add some outdoor exercise equipment
- *Refresher First Aid training/CPR for all year groups in KS 2.
- *Large play equipment or a climbing frame for KS1
- *Sports day trophies, awards and equipment
- *Bounce trampets
- *microscopes for playtimes
