Definitions		
	Autumn 	The season when warm summer temperatures gradually decrease to the cold of winter. Autumn is a time of change, leaves change colour and fall from trees. Animals begin to prepare for winter. They grow thicker coats or store food for the winter.
	Diwali	Diwali is the five- day festival of lights celebrated by Hindus, Sikhs and Jains.
	Bonfire Night	November 5 th , also known as Fireworks night and Guy Fawkes night. Annual commemoration of the failed Gunpowder Plot of 1605
	Guy Fawkes 	Also known as Guido Fawkes. He was a Catholic. Was caught trying to blow up King James I in the houses of parliament in 1605.
	Remembrance Day	November 11 th to remember soldiers who died in wars. We wear Poppies as a symbol
	Thanksgiving 	Celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November. It is a national holiday in America, Canada, Grenada, Saint Lucia and Liberia. Families come together and have roast turkey and are thankful for the Harvest. Originating from the colonial pilgrim's meal in 1621.
	Advent	The time leading up to Christmas. It comes from the Latin word meaning 'coming'. Christians mark the four Sundays in Advent as a way to prepare their hearts for the coming of Jesus.
	Christmas	It is a holiday to celebrate the birth of Jesus. The name is a joining of 'Christ' and 'mass' which means the holy mass (supper, celebration or festival) of Christ
	Birthday	The day or anniversary of someone's birth.
