

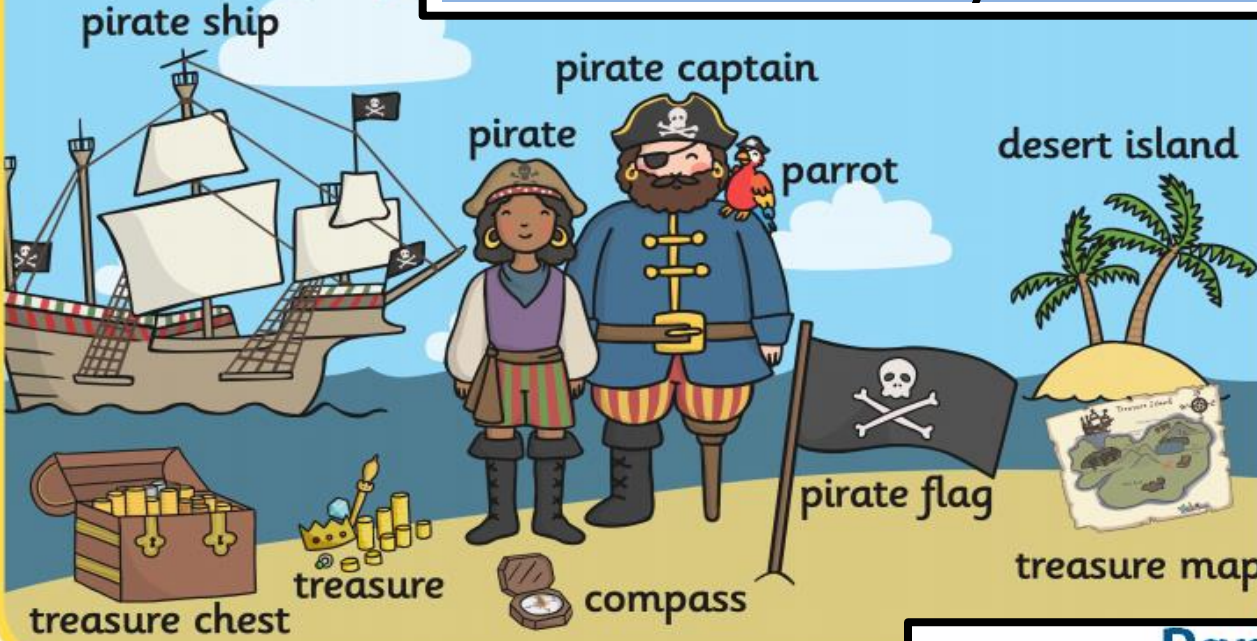

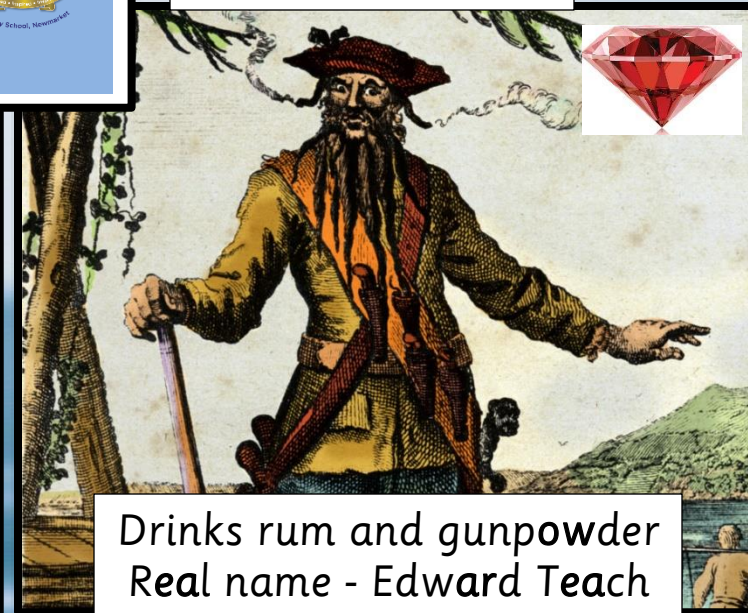

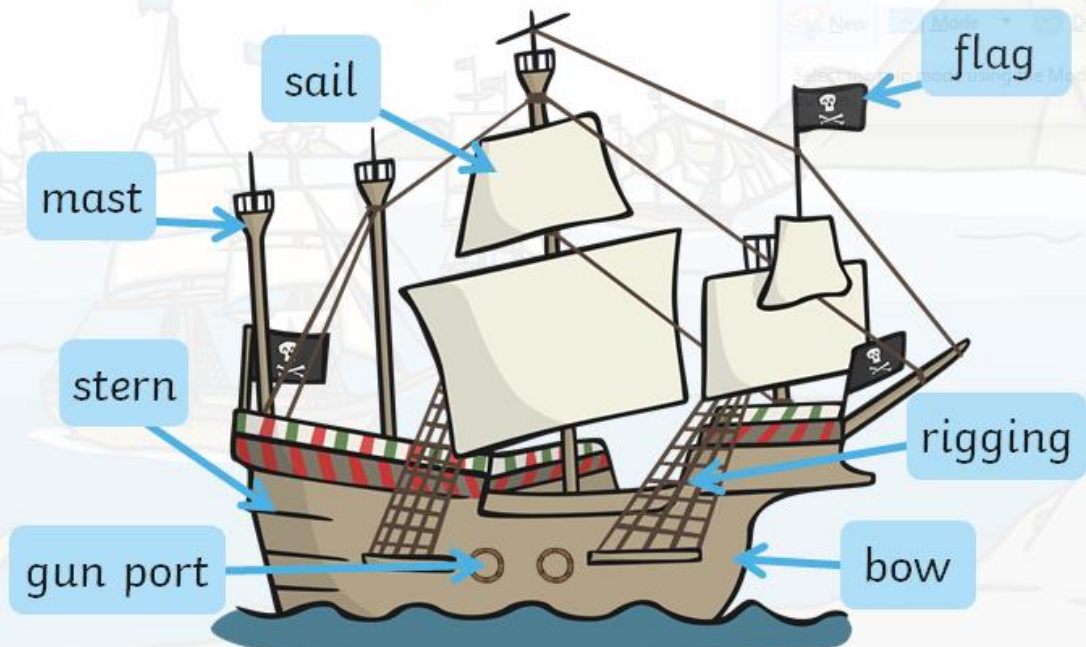

Key People



Black Beard
1680-1718



An English pirate who sailed around the West Indies and North America. He became a renowned pirate. He got his nickname because of his thick black beard
Real name Edward Teach
A pirate for only two years.
Married 14 times.
He was shot.

Anne Bonny
1702-1782



An Irish pirate who often disguised herself as a man and became one of the most recognisable wanted faces of the 'Golden Age of Piracy'.
Excellent fighter
The girlfriend of Calico Jack.
She ran away from Ireland at 16

New Vocabulary

Pirate



A pirate is a sailor who attacks other ships at sea and steals their property.

Piracy

Piracy is an act of attacking and robbing ships at sea.

Cutlass



A short sword with a slightly curved blade used by pirates.

Booty



Treasure (like money or jewels) stolen by pirates. obtained by stealing, plundering and pillaging

Jolly Roger



A pirates flag consisting of a white skull and crossbones on a black background

Pirate Code

A code of conduct for pirates to follow

Treasure Map



A map that shows the location of buried treasure
