What we have learnt already

I can tell you the names of people in my family tree. I can talk about things that have happened in my family during my lifetime. I can find out things that happened in my family before I was born.

I can name and recognise Queen Victoria. I know that Queen Victoria was the Queen of England over 150 years ago.

I can recall significant events that have happened in my life in the UK (Queen's Sapphire Jubilee (65yrs) in 2017, Duke and Duchess of Sussex got married in 2018, the Queen's Jubilee in 2022).

I can explain how toys have changed over time (linked to materials used). I can sort toys linked to their age. I know children played with different toys and can name them (diablo, whip & top and hoop & stick).

I know that Florence Nightingale was also known as The Lady with the Lamp (so she could check the injured soldiers). I can name and recognise Florence Nightingale. I know that Florence Nightingale was a Nurse.

Facts I need to know

I know that the Clock Tower in Newmarket was built to remember Queen Victoria's Golden Jubillee. I can identify Victorian houses in Newmarket. I can describe the features (decorative brickwork, chimney, bay and sash windows and an outside toilet). I can identify Victorian buildings in Newmarket (Clock Tower & School).

I know how the seaside has changed over time (bathing machines, fully clothed, seabathing).

I know that Queen Victoria reigned for nearly 64 years and was the longest serving monarch until Queen Elizabeth II. I know that Queen Elizabeth II is now the longest serving monarch from 1952-2022.
