## Words we need to know

1	Compass	A piece of equipment that tells you what direction you are travelling in. The main compass points are north, south, east and west.
2	Human feature	A feature that has been made or changed by people.
4	Houses of parliament	The place where governments meet to discuss how the country is run.
5	Monument	A reminder of an even that happened.
6	Atlas	A collection of maps in one book.
7	Continent	A very large area of land that includes all the islands with it. There are 7 continents: Africa, Antarctica, Australasia, Asia, Europe, north America and South America.
8	Ocean	A large area of water. There are 5 oceans: the Arctic, Atlantic, Indian, Pacific and Southern Oceans.
