

Year 2 Homework Summer 1



Children should complete at least 2 sessions of 15 minutes a week on spelling shed and numbots. In addition, Year 2 children can choose <u>one</u> activity from the six coloured BIG IDEAS during this half term. If children need some resources to complete the tasks please ask Mrs Jordan. Please send into school once completed and children can share their learning with the class.

Days to bring things:

Everyday: Group Reading books - these are usually changed on Friday but sometimes needed on other days. **Everyday: Individual Reading books and Sharing book -** children are free to change these as often as they wish. **Thursdays: Spelling books.**

WEEKLY ENGLISH HOMEWORK: Read at home for at least 10 mins three times a week. Spelling practice – in books and on Spelling Shed.	WEEKLY MATHS HOMEWORK: NumBots covers key Maths skills and children enjoy playing the games.
Language: In class we are learning about writing postcards and letters. Can you write a letter to someone you don't see very often? Remember to include capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and describing words to make it more interesting!	Britain: We are looking at how farming has changed in the last 100 years in history this half term. Can you find out about a different job and how that has changed in the last 100 years?
People: We are learning about different farmers in class. Do you know anyone who is a farmer or who likes to look after their garden? Can you interview them? Find out what they like to grow, how they grow it, when they plant their plants and why they like to grow things.	Faith: Our value this term is Creativity. 'Whatever you do; work at it with all your heart as working for the Lord'. Colossians 3 verse 23. Can you help someone else in a creative way? You could bake for them, make a card, do some jobs, read them a story, help walk their dog! There are lots and lots of ways!
Migration: Make a list of all the differences you know between living in a city and the countryside. Remember when you are writing to use your capital letters, commas, full stops, and the words 'and', 'or' and 'because'.	Creativity: Design a vegetable garden. Think about what you would like to grow, how many of each plant you might need, how you would reach the plants in the middle of the garden. You can draw it, make a model or actually plant a vegetable garden.
