#### Words we need to know

Hemisphere	A half of the earth, either the northern half or the southern half
Equator	An imaginary line halfway around the earth, dividing the northern and southern hemisphere
Tropical	A hot, moist climate that occurs near the equator.
Tropical rainforest	A tropical evergreen forest which has a climate of high humidity, constant temperature, high rainfall and tall trees which form a canopy.
Climate	The weather conditions in one area over a long period of time.
Humidity	Is a measure of the amount of water vapour in the air.
Indigenous	Belonging to a particular place rather than coming to it from somewhere else.
