Summer 1 – Wonders of the world - Egypt



Children should complete the weekly Maths and English tasks every week to maintain their core skills. In addition, children can choose one activity from our BIG IDEAS each week. It doesn't matter which order children complete the tasks but by the end of half term aim to have ALL activities completed! If children need some resources to complete the tasks please ask the class teacher. Each week we will share and celebrate the children's work on WEDNESDAYS.

<p>WEEKLY ENGLISH HOMEWORK: At least 10mins daily reading practice – AIM HIGH for 15mins a day! Spelling practice – look, cover check and write these words in sentences if needed. A new set of spellings will be sent home weekly. Year 4 will also be sent a piece of English homework weekly.</p>	<p>WEEKLY MATHS HOMEWORK: Times tables practice – games, songs, oral reciting, TT Rockstars etc. can be used to support this at home. Year 4 will be sent a piece of Maths homework weekly.</p>
<p>Language: Create a glossary for key words that you have learnt about the Egyptian Civilisation – here's some vocabulary to get you started! Remember a glossary needs to be in alphabetical order and give definitions. Civilisation, canopic jars, pyramids, Tutankhamun, Pharaoh, mummification, ancient, hieroglyphics, sarcophagus</p>	<p>Britain: How does Britain differ from Egypt in climate, population, land use and wealth? Research how the 2 countries differ. Create some notes about Britain and Egypt to show similarities and differences.</p>
<p>People: How did the Egyptians live? Were there rich and poor? How did they differ? Research Tutankhamun and Cleopatra and write a one page non chronological report about one of them.</p>	<p>Faith: Research Egyptian gods – what did the Egyptians believe about their gods? Can you create some artwork to display the gods and some facts about what you have learned.</p>
<p>Migration: Did people migrate in ancient civilisations or did they live their whole lives in one place? What did they know about the wider world? In contrast, can you find out how many people visit Egypt on holiday each year? (not COVID times, but before 2020 or after 2022)</p>	<p>Creativity: Create a sarcophagus from papier mache and decorate with Egyptian artwork and hieroglyphics or some canopic jars, or a pyramid from lego!</p>
