1 Chronology	I know that Stone Age Britain began in 850,000BC
2 People	I know about jobs that people did during the Stone Age

Facts I need to know – KNOWLEDGE GEMS

1 Chronology	I know that Ancient Egypt began in 3150 BC and King Narmer was the first Egyptian Pharaoh. I can place key events during Egyptian times on a timeline e.g when the pyramids were built in 2650BC.
2 Chronology	I can describe the similarities and differences between ancient and modern Egypt; including the importance of the river Nile for the early civilization and today.
3 People	I can name and explain the social order of people during Ancient Egyptians times (Pharaoh, advisor to the Pharaoh, high priests & nobles, priests, engineers, doctors, scribes, craftsmen, soldiers, farmers and tomb builders).
4 People	I can explain how we know that Tutankhamun was a great Pharaoh and how important he was from the artefacts found in his tomb. I can explain why Howard Carter was a good archaeologist in finding Tutankhamun's tomb.
5 Legacy	I describe Ancient Egyptian mythology and retell the story of Isis, Osiris, Seth. I can make comparisons of the Ancient Egyptian creation story with others I know already.
6 Legacy	I can identify sources historical evidence and explain key legacies of the Ancient Egyptians including the pyramids, hieroglyphics, sphinx and Egyptian tombs.

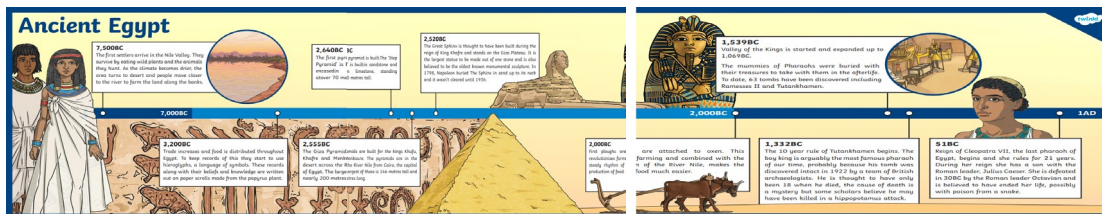


Words we need to know

1 pharaoh	An Ancient Egyptian leader. A vizier was second in command (advisor)
2 pyramid	The Ancient Egyptian tombs of some of the pharaoh
3 sarcophagus	A stone coffin, usually highly decorated, for a pharaoh
4 afterlife	Life after death
5 hieroglyphics	Ancient Egyptian symbols for writing
6 Rosetta Stone	Stone allowed the hieroglyphs to be translated – it was a mystery until then.
7 Canopic jars	The 4 jars the organs were placed into
8 Papyrus	Writing material made from weaving dried reeds from the Nile
