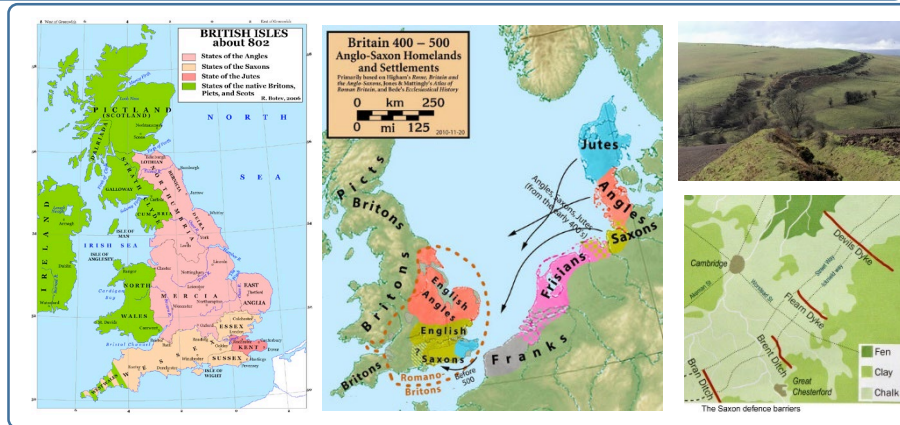


CHRONOLOGY	I can place the Anglo-Saxon period in chronological order on a timeline of British history.

1	Picts	Invaders people from Scotland
2	Scots	Invaders from the Ireland
3	Jutes	Invaders from Belgium, who mainly settled in Kent, Hampshire and on the Isle of Wight
4	Saxons	Invaders from Germany, who settled in Sussex, Essex, Wessex and Middlesex.
5	Angles	Invaders from Denmark, who settled mostly in East Anglia, the East Midlands and Northumbria.
6	Vortigern	King whom was left in charge after the Roman armies left
7	Earthwork	Earthen barriers-dykes or ditches
8	King Offa	An Anglo-Saxon King of Mercia from 757 to 796
9	County	a smaller area of the UK containing lots of towns and villages.
10	Kingdom	The seven Anglo-Saxon Kingdoms were Northumbria, Mercia, East Anglia, Essex, Kent, Sussex and Wessex
11	Wergild	A payment system used in Anglo-Saxon times to settle disputes between the criminal and the victim or the victim's family.
