Locate	Locational Knowledge: I can locate Scandinavia's countries and major cities on a world map
	Locational Knowledge: I can explore the physical features of Scandinavia (glaciers, fjords, mountains, lakes and waterfalls).
Navigate	Fieldwork skills: I can measure, record and compare the climate and weather of Scandinavia (Climate zones in northern Europe) with the United Kingdom.

Words we need to know:

Fjord	A long, narrow inlet of the sea, bordered by steep cliffs or hills, typically formed by the submergence of a glaciated valley.
Tundra	A vast, treeless, and flat Arctic region characterized by low temperatures, short growing seasons, and permafrost.
Taiga	The vast forested region of Scandinavia, primarily dominated by coniferous trees like spruce and pine.
Lapland	A region that stretches across northern Norway, Sweden, Finland, and parts of Russia, known for its Arctic landscapes and indigenous Sámi culture.
Ice Cap	A mass of glacial ice and snow covering an extensive area, such as the Vatnajökull ice cap in Iceland.
Mountain Pass	A route through a mountain range, often used as a transportation corridor, like the Dovre Pass in Norway.
Invade	To enter and occupy land
