The children are set weekly maths and English tasks to consolidate, practise, maintain and extend their core skillsthese tasks are not optional.

WEEKLY ENGLISH HOMEWORK:

- An average of 15 minutes reading at home per day.

Britain: How did the Ancient Greeks change the world of sport? The Greeks loved sport as much as we do. They enjoyed the discus, javelin, long jump, boxing and horse racing. Athletes prayed to Nike, the goddess of victory - she's still a big name in sport today!

Idea one: Imagine you are Alexander the Great and have just conquered Persia - can describe the battles they fought to conquer this land, and describe what it's like there?

Idea two: Maybe you could write a biography of Alexander the Great, depicting why he was so important and special

Idea three: Could you imagine you are a talk show host and you are interviewing this Ancient Greek king? What sort of questions would you ask him?
